THE PFORZHEIMER COLLECTION

The following is a list of Garfield-Perry members who have contributed works of there own to the Pforzheimer Collection. The Collection was started in 1941 by Harry Pforzheimer, a G-P member. The idea came to him when he was presented with some material that did not fit into his collection. He determined that the club library would be a suitable place for these items.
