Minutes of the 3907 th meeting, January 8, 1988

Justin Underwood brought us up to date on philatelic news. Australia will celebrate its bicentennial with a joint stamp issue with the U.S. A fire in the main P.O. in Victoria has forced the relocation of the philatelic office, among other things. Charlie Ball announced that the Club had received prospectuses and applications for the APS Stampshow to be held in Detroit during August.

Ball also passed around a copy of the G-P 40th anniversary banquet program lavishly printed 1930 get-together. After a good banquet, members were treated to piano music by the famed Arthur Loesser. The program also illustrated two special medals honoring Garfield-Perry which appear to have been given out, but the recipients and the whereabouts of these is unknown.

Dick Parker showed us a "cover-of-the-week" bearing a 6¢ Tax Departmental cancelled in Cleveland, Ca. 1870. Since it was not on a department corner card there was some suspicion of its authenticity.

March Party notes: Letters have gone out to the Cleveland postmaster with sketches of the show cancel. The POD has been asked to man their booth all three days of the show. Reg Morris noted that the Machine Cancel Society will hold its annual meeting in conjunction with the 1989 March Party.

Charlie Ball reviewed upcoming entertainment. He then administered the oath of installation to G-P trustees who were present. These were: Allen, Morris, Parker, Pulver, Smith and Stanger.

In the absence of the president and Secretary, the only report tendered was that of Mr. Allen, Treasurer. He noted that the balance of funds in the Club treasury at the end of December, '87 was about \$26,900, of which \$9,050 were prepayments and other funds earmarked for this years MARCH PARTY. The General Fund ended the year positive by \$48, and the Shafer Fund stood at \$5040. Bottom line is the Club is healthy financially.

There was a short discussion on how the Club could attract new blood and otherwise appeal to more stamp collectors. Reg Morris felt we should do more to help the intermediate collector and thus attract attention.

Charlie Ball gave a short philatelic program which included an 1846 stampless folded letter from Hongkong to London. He also showed us some HK letters beaing 5¢ revenue stamps used for regular postage during a 9-day period in January of 1938 when such use was authorized.

Meeting adjourned at 9:25.
