Bob Feltus said the dealers really enjoyed the Wine & Cheese party and the Hospitality Suite - especially liked it being open on Thursday evening.

Steve Kaplan had been at Interpet and said that the dealers he talked to that had been at March Party were very pleased with it - they weren't doing quite as well at Interpet.

Vince reported favorable reviews from youth and parents alike. The new location was a big success and there was standing room only at times. He was grateful for the fine help he received in running the table. There was some discussion on how we might encourage more local participation in the youth exhibits.

Yanis distributed geographic breakdown of the attendance and reported that the attendance of 1991 was exactly the same as last year. A comment was made that our members and committee looked especially nice with go bags in suits, etc. It was suggested that we print the show hours on the cards when sent out next year.
