Among the points Mr. Azenus brought to our attention: There needs to be established, say a couple of years in advance, a local committee of about 30 serious workers, including (internal Chairman, Literature Subcommitte Ch., Registration (at least 5 people throughout the show), Treasurer, Seminars and Meetings Ch., Sales Table staff, Jurors Ch., Awards Ch.

The APS "runs the show" all contacts, publicity, printing, lining up exhibits, dealing with dealers, etc., etc. The local committee is basically for mounting and taking down exhibits, managing registration and souvenir tables, and a bit of general running hospitality. They have no need to do an audience of the show other than getting themselves organized, then a busy 3 days with the show.

In response to questions from the group, Mr. Azenus brought out the following:

1. There are usually above 200 or so pre-registers to be processed in advance of the show.
2. The Bruce ch. bridges dealers and helps them move in and out.
3. Cleaning and maintaining their downtown exhibitor spaces a fairly large and well coordinated group (say, 90).
4. The official hotel could accommodate about 1000 room-nights.
5. No outside vendor designed for "sponsors" are anticipated.
6. APS deals with Postal Service.
7. APS does the opening reception.
8. About 30 affiliated societies typically come -- lots of meetings and programs.
