





The Handstamp – The First Year



Handstamp Details


- Die 1
 - July 26, 1908 1916
- Die 2
 - 1916 June 24, 1919
- Trips 2-10 reported
 - 4 and 10 most common
 - 3, 5 and 9 most difficult


American Flag - Details

- April 4, 1908 November 11, 1917
 - Possible overlap with Universal Model B machine
 - Exists killer-only
- Trips 2-10
 - Trips 4 and 9 most common
 - Trips 2, 3, 5, 10 are scarce


Universal Model B – Die 2 – Missing Periods



Universal Model B - Details

- Die 1
 - August 1, 1911 September 9, 1914
 - Trips 1-2, 4-10
 - Trips 4 and 6 are the most common
 - Trips 1, 2 and 5 are scarce; Trip 10 is unreported
- Die 2
 - October 2, 1914 July 17, 1917
 - Trips 1-2, 4-10
 - Trips 4 and 8 are the most common
 - Trips 1, 2, 5, 7 and 10 are scarce
 - Possible varieties with missing periods and damaged dial rim

Universal "Trip in Dial" Details

- Believed to be a Station B machine used on a temporary basis
- 1912 use: June 29 July 20.
 - ~12 examples reported
- 1914 use: September 8 October 1.
 - 4 examples reported

Universal Model D



Universal Model D Details

- Features times instead of trips
- Exists killer-only
- June 25, 1917 May 16, 1919
 - Possible overlap with Model B machine
 - Most examples from 11am or 4pm trips
 - Other times are scarce or unreported


