## OBITUARIES

### Carl A. Scheele

Services for Carl A. Scheele, 77, retired commercial artist and advertising executive, will be at 1 p.m. tomorrow at Wischmeier-Buesch funeral home, 3111 Broadview Rd.

Mr. Scheele had a heart attack and died Monday at his near West Side home. It was the house in which he had been born and which was built by his late father.

His career began in 1920 as a commercial artist at the old Ad Service Engraving Co., once the largest photoengraving firm in Ohio.

He retired in 1970 as artist and production manager at Brand Advertising Inc.

He left Ad Service in 1940 to be manager and an artist at the E.J. Imhof Lithograph Co. Five years later, he moved to his own art studio in the Caxton Building downtown.

In 1950, he returned to Ad Service as assistant superintendent and a partner. When the firm was dissolved in 1960, he worked at the Scheel Co. until he became production manager at Brand in 1965.

He attended Lincoln High School and the old Cleveland School of Art. He painted watercolors for recreation, and his work was shown in several May Shows.

He was a member of the Garfield Perry Stamp Society and a former member of Deke lodge of the Knights of Pythias.

Mr. Scheele's interest in historical artifacts and natural history are reflected in the professions of his sons: Carl H. of Arlington, Va., is a curator at the National Museum of American History of the Smithsonian Institution, and Harry G. of Ann Arbor, Mich., is an archeologist with the National Park Service.

Also surviving are his wife, Frances, and four grandchildren.
