



Elizabeth Hisey – Elizabeth has been involved with the hobby for over 20 years. 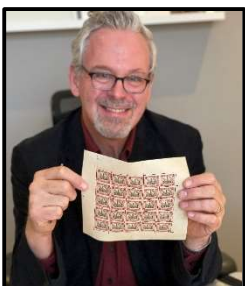
